

First Time and Transfer Students

To be considered for admission into a graduate program at Embry-Riddle, all applicants must have earned a baccalaureate degree from an accredited degree-granting institution. For applicants with educational experience outside of the United States, refer to the International Admissions (<https://catalog.erau.edu/admissions/international-applicants/>) requirements.

Admission into some degree programs may require an applicant to have a higher GPA, meet other special requirements, and/or submit additional documentation. Refer to program specific pages (<https://catalog.erau.edu/admissions/program-criteria/>) for additional requirements. Academic, judicial, and disciplinary notations on transcripts will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and may impact admission.

Graduate applicants are required to submit the following documentation:

- Application for admission
- Non-refundable application fee
- Official transcript(s) from the accredited degree-conferring institution(s)
- Official or unofficial transcripts from other institutions attended may be requested to verify prerequisite knowledge for certain academic programs
- Official transcripts from all accredited degree-granting institutions showing graduate-level course work, if applicable

Supporting Documents

Admissions documentation may vary by campus and students may be required to submit the following supporting documentation to the respective admissions office.

GMAT/GRE Test Scores

Official test scores may be required for admission consideration into specific programs. Refer to program specific pages for additional details.

Statement of Objectives

A statement of objective helps to demonstrate strong capacity for written communication. The statement should include:

- A description of the applicant's long-term professional goals, defining how Embry-Riddle's program supports those interests and goals
- A description of the applicant's interests and background
- A research topic proposal, if applicable

Letters of Recommendation

Letters of recommendation should consist of academic and professional references. Refer to program specific criteria (<https://catalog.erau.edu/admissions/program-criteria/>) for the number and types of references.

Resume

Submit a current resume outlining your past educational and work experiences.

Admission into some degree programs may require an applicant to have a higher GPA, meet other special requirements, and/or submit additional documentation. Refer to program specific pages (<https://catalog.erau.edu/admissions/program-criteria/>) for additional requirements.

Worldwide & Asia Campus

In addition to previously stated requirements, all graduate applicants must have earned a baccalaureate degree from an accredited degree-granting institution, with a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale from their degree-granting institution.

Graduate applicants who have completed graduate level coursework or already possess a master's degree from an accredited degree-granting institution must have a 3.0 CGPA or higher at the graduate level.
