MHSR 500 Introduction to Human Security 3 Credits (3,0)

Overview of Human Security paradigm; defining and measuring human security; economic and food vulnerabilities; case studies on global instability and conflict.

MHSR 511 Cybersecurity, Governance, and Human Security 3 Credits (3,0)

Cyber technologies shaping governance, security, and societal resilience. Cyber communication tools and social organization; civic engagement and political movements; intelligence implications of cyber networks; population resilience and hybrid threats; digital authoritarianism, surveillance, and information operations; regulation of digital networks by states and private stakeholders; ethical and policy frameworks for resilient societies.

MHSR 515 International Law and U.S. Security Policy 3 Credits (3,0)

Role of international law and U.S. foreign policy in terrorism, crime, and crises; U.S. law and international norms; privacy law and legal challenges in unified response.

MHSR 520 Principles of International Conflict Resolution 3 Credits (3,0)

Types of organized violent conflicts; diplomatic, economic, legal, and military approaches to conflict resolution; case studies of international conflict resolution efforts.

MHSR 530 Environmental Security 3 Credits (3,0)

Impact of environmental issues on U.S. domestic and foreign policy; transnational environmental threats; projects linking global experiences to environmental security challenges.

MHSR 540 Foundations of Resilience 3 Credits (3,0)

Resilience as a dynamic, multi-dimensional concept. Anticipation, detection, response, adaptation, and recovery across cyber, disaster, and asymmetric security environments; design and management of resilient infrastructures, organizations, and communities; risk assessment and crisis communication; adaptive strategies for evolving threats.

MHSR 550 Resilience Planning and Administration 3 Credits (3,0)

Contemporary strategies for building and sustaining resilience to disasters and crises. Resilience planning at individual, community, organizational, and governmental levels; interdisciplinary research and evidence-based approaches; preparedness, response, recovery, and long-term sustainability; digital technologies and data analytics; climate adaptation strategies.
