GOVT 353 Early U.S. Foreign Policy 3 Credits (3,0)

Exploration of U.S. foreign policy from the Colonial Era through World War I, focusing on cultural, economic, and political aspects.

GOVT 399 Special Topics in Government 1-6 Credit (1-6,0)

Individual, independent, or directed studies of selected topics in government.

Study of American constitutional law and individual rights. Government powers, federalism, Bill of Rights, and separation of powers as interpreted by the U.S. Supreme Court.

Study of contemporary globalization and world order. Topics include sovereignty, multinational corporations, trade, environmental issues, terrorism, and human rights.
