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## GSIS 100 Introduction to Global Security 3 Credits (3,0)

Introduction to Global Security and Intelligence Studies. Topics include intelligence collection, analysis, security of government/private facilities, law enforcement, forensic science, and cybersecurity.

## GSIS 185 Risk Intelligence and Management 3 Credits (3,0)

Introduction to risk concepts in decision-making. Principles of risk assessment and management; cost-benefit analysis in business, security, and intelligence contexts.

## GSIS 199 Special Topics in Global Security and Intelligence Studies 1-6 Credit (1-6,0)

Individual, independent, or directed studies of selected topics in global security and intelligence studies.

## GSIS 205 Assessing and Managing Risk 3 Credits (0,3)

Introduction to risk concepts in decision-making. Principles of risk assessment and management; cost-benefit analysis in security/intelligence contexts.

## GSIS 210 Security Fundamentals 3 Credits (3,0)

Concepts of security, threat assessment, personnel/physical/information security. Personnel security screening methods, security equipment, sensitive information protection, and investigative methods.

## GSIS 299 Special Topics in Global Security and Intelligence Studies 1-6 Credit (1-6,0)

Individual, independent, or directed studies of selected topics in global security and intelligence studies.

## GSIS 312 Global Crime and International Justice Systems 3 Credits (3,0)

Status and trends in global crime. Effects of globalization on criminal activities and justice systems. Emphasizes multicultural perspectives.

## GSIS 315 Studies in Global Intelligence 3 Credits (3,0)

Strategic intelligence in policy shaping. Models of intelligence collection, analysis, and production. Ethical issues in intelligence. Counterintelligence.

## GSIS 317 Political Change, Revolution, and War 3 Credits (3,0)

Political change through wars, revolutions, and evolutionary trends. Predictive analysis of systemic changes in international politics.

## GSIS 320 Global History, Politics, and Culture 3 Credits (3,0)

Focus on a world region, culture, historical period, or international problem. Emphasizes multicultural and world historical perspectives.

## GSIS 323 Intelligence and Technology 3 Credits (3,0)

Overview of intelligence technology since World War II. Collection methodologies: aircraft, space-based vehicles, imagery, signals intelligence. Examination of emerging UAV technologies.

## GSIS 325 Foundations of Terrorism 3 Credits (3,0)

History, causes, and counterterrorism strategies from the 19th century to the present. Terrorist group methodologies and future implications.

## GSIS 328 Intelligence Analysis and Briefing 3 Credits (3,0)

Strengthening analytical and communication skills. Predictive analysis, modeling, computer-based programs, and intelligence briefs under tight deadlines.

## GSIS 330 World Political Thought 3 Credits (3,0)

Survey of political thought from classical China, India, Greece, Rome, and beyond. Focus on key thinkers and political philosophies.

## GSIS 335 Counter-Intelligence 3 Credits (3,0)

Examination of counterintelligence techniques to protect intelligence communities from external penetration. Focus on espionage, betrayal motivations, and case studies of U.S. counterintelligence operations.

## GSIS 340 Security Investigations and Interview 3 Credits (3,0)

Elicitation techniques in security investigations. Observation of body language and cues in interviews. Planning and conducting mock investigations.

## GSIS 342 Interview Techniques and Tactics 3 Credits (3,0)

Techniques for interviewing witnesses and suspects. Legal, psychological aspects of interviewing in criminal justice, security, and intelligence contexts.

## GSIS 345 Terrorism and US Foreign Policy 3 Credits (3,0)

Examination of international terrorism and U.S. counterterrorism policy. Topics include the evolution of terrorist organizations, state-sponsored terrorism, and U.S. responses.

### **GSIS 350 Open Source Intelligence (OSINT) 3 Credits (3,0)**

Open-source intelligence data collection and analysis. Focus on deep web research and critical evaluation of unclassified information.

### **GSIS 352 White Collar Crime 3 Credits (3,0)**

Examination of white-collar crimes and their consequences. Discussion of major cases and financial impacts. Education and research-based solutions.

### **GSIS 355 Crisis Management and Recovery 3 Credits (3,0)**

Business continuity planning in response to threats and hazards. Business impact analysis, risk mitigation strategies, and continuity plans for critical sectors.

### **GSIS 365 Project Management 3 Credits (3,0)**

Fundamentals of project management. Emphasis on project management within physical security. Defined by the Project Management Institute.

### **GSIS 399 Special Topics in Global Security and Intelligence Studies 1-6 Credit (1-6,0)**

Individual, independent, or directed studies of selected topics in global security and intelligence studies.

### **GSIS 400 International Security and Globalization 3 Credits (3,0)**

Analysis of international security issues related to scientific and technological change. Topics include political violence, intelligence analysis, organized crime, and public health.

### **GSIS 406 American National Security Policy: Theory and Practice 3 Credits (3,0)**

Issues influencing national security decision-making. Roles of agencies and departments in policy formulation and execution.

### **GSIS 414 Government and Corporate Security Management 3 Credits (3,0)**

Security concepts in government and corporate organizations. Focus on personnel screening, information protection, and physical security equipment. Draft security plans and policies.

### **GSIS 416 Middle Eastern Comparative Law 3 Credits (3,0)**

Comparative analysis of Jewish and Middle Eastern legal traditions with secular and religious law (e.g., U.S. Constitutional law, Islamic law, Canon law). Interdisciplinary examination enhances understanding of Western legal principles and related disciplines within Judaism and Islam.

### **GSIS 420 Aviation Security and Technology 3 Credits (3,0)**

Application of core security disciplines (communications, operations, physical, and personnel security) to aviation. Topics include hijackings, CBRN attacks, airport hardening, biometrics, post-9/11 responses, and aviation security technologies.

### **GSIS 421 History and Philosophy of Law/ Jurisprudence 3 Credits (3,0)**

Examination of legal theories and practices influencing U.S. law, including feminist legal theory, legal pragmatism, critical race theory, and centrist legal theory. Students deliver presentations and final papers.

### **GSIS 422 Homeland Security and Technology 3 Credits (3,0)**

Analysis of key issues in U.S. homeland defense, including transportation, border security, and the role of federal, state, and local agencies.

Exploration of legal and ethical considerations related to national security and privacy.

### **GSIS 425 Information Protection and Computer Security 3 Credits (3,0)**

Overview of information protection programs in government and private sectors. Topics include physical security practices, hardware and software protection, detection and investigation of computer crimes, and developing information security programs.

### **GSIS 426 Physical Security and Facility Design 3 Credits (3,0)**

Application of security concepts to protect people, information, and facilities. Topics include security audits, blueprint reading, equipment selection, and capital budgeting for retrofitting facilities.

### **GSIS 428 Supply Chain Security 3 Credits (3,0)**

Examination of the supply chain's critical role in global operations, with a focus on U.S. Customs programs and protecting materials during transit.

### **GSIS 430 Emergency Management and Contingency Planning 3 Credits (3,0)**

Overview of emergency management concepts, focusing on preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery. Topics include leadership roles, National Response Framework, and contingency planning for disasters.

### **GSIS 435 Enterprise Risk Management 3 Credits**

Principles and practices of Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) as applied to global security and intelligence contexts. Emphasis is placed on integrating intelligence analysis, organizational psychology, and security management into ERM frameworks. Through case studies, simulations, and applied projects, students will develop the skills to evaluate and mitigate risks at the enterprise level.

**GSIS 470 Senior Cooperative Internship 3****Credits (3,0)**

Internship in security and intelligence, applying academic knowledge in a professional environment. Research and analysis of security or intelligence problems.

Simulation-based project for senior GSIS students. Teams assume roles of intelligence case officers in political, military, economic, or technological fields. Demonstration of skills in intelligence tasking, briefings, risk analysis, covert action, espionage, counterintelligence, and operations in today's globalized world.

Role-play-based practicum in security operations. Focus on clearance procedures, security violation investigations, and handling day-to-day personnel security issues.
