MILS 101 Basic Military Science I 1 Credit (1,2)

Introduction to the Army and Soldier skills; Army Profession and professional standards; Army Leadership Requirements Model (LRM); Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) structure, purpose, and benefits; map reading and land navigation; fieldcraft basics; first aid principles; team-building exercises; weekly lab sessions led by MS III Cadets.

MILS 101L Basic Military Science I Laboratory 0 Credits (1,5)

Leadership development for Army Officer Corps; preparation for Cadet Summer Training; weekly two-hour labs led by advanced-course cadets under cadre supervision; squad-level tactics, first aid, land navigation, drill and ceremonies; hands-on experiential learning to build confidence, competence, and leadership abilities.

MILS 102 Basic Military Science II 1 Credit (1,2)

Personal challenges and leadership competencies; critical thinking and resilience; holistic health and fitness; communication skills; Antiterrorism awareness; tactical basics including team and squad components, movements, patrolling, and battle drills; hands-on training in weekly labs led by MS III Cadets and supervised by MS IVs and cadre.

MILS 102L Basic Military Science II Laboratory 0 Credits (1,5)

Leadership development for Army Officer Corps; preparation for Cadet Summer Training; weekly two-hour labs; advanced-course cadets lead instruction under cadre supervision; squad-level tactics, first aid, land navigation, drill and ceremonies; hands-on experiential learning to build confidence, competence, and leadership abilities.

MILS 199 Special Topics in Military Science (Army ROTC) 1-6 Credit (1-6,0)

Individual, independent, or directed studies of selected topics in military science.

MILS 201 Leadership and Ethics 2 Credits (1,2)

Leadership and ethics; leadership styles and self-assessment; analysis of famous leaders; Army Profession, cultural awareness, values, and ethics; application to leadership scenarios; Army Values, Ethics, and the Law of Armed Conflict; historical vignettes and small group discussions; hands-on training in weekly labs led by MS III Cadets and supervised by MS IVs and cadre.

MILS 201L Basic Military Leadership I Laboratory 0 Credits (1,1)

Leadership skills for Army Officer Corps; focus on Cadet Summer Training; two-hour weekly labs led by advanced-course cadets under cadre supervision; squad-level tactics, first aid, land navigation, drill and ceremonies; experiential learning to build confidence, competence, and leadership abilities.

MILS 202 Army Doctrine and Decision-Making 2 Credits (2,2)

Army doctrine and decision-making; analytical techniques and creative thinking; Army problem-solving process; Troop Leading Procedures (TLPs) and Operations Orders (OPORD); Army Doctrine and Symbolology; squad tactics in Multidomain Operations, Offensive Operations, and Defensive Operations; hands-on training in weekly labs led by MS III Cadets and supervised by MS IVs and cadre.

MILS 202L Basic Military Leadership II Laboratory 0 Credits (2,2)

Leadership preparation for Army Officer Corps; emphasis on Cadet Summer Training; two-hour weekly labs; instruction on squad-level tactics, first aid, land navigation, and drill and ceremonies; advanced-course cadets lead under cadre supervision; experiential learning to build confidence, competence, and foundational leadership skills.

Training management fundamentals; Warfighting Functions; Army operational processes; planning, preparation, and execution of squad-level small unit tactics; application of training management principles.
