SSES 110 Critical Thinking in Contemporary Problems 3 Credits (3,0)

Development of critical thinking skills through conceptualization, analysis, and evaluation of contemporary international affairs, disasters, and security crises.

SSES 111 Countering Human Trafficking 3 Credits (3,0)

Dimensions of human trafficking, underlying causes, and global impacts on individuals and communities. Human security frameworks in combating trafficking at local, national, and international levels. The role of the aviation industry in prevention and response. Identification of key indicators and support for survivors in prevention efforts.

SSES 199 Special Topics in Security and Emergency Services 1-6 Credit (1-6,0)

SSES 224 Analytic Tradecraft Writing 3 Credits (3,0)

Based on an introduction to the intelligence cycle - the process for gathering, analyzing, and using information to reduce threats - this course focuses on its analysis, production, and dissemination stages.

GIS theory and practical applications of GIST. History of GIS; GIS software; data acquisition; data quality and ethics; interpretation and analysis; mapping; cartography.
