

B.S. in Forensic Psychology

Forensic Psychology is the application of psychological principles and evidence-based practices to legal issues and processes, such as, for example, criminal investigations and adjudications. The Forensic Psychology program develops professionals trained in the science of human behavior and mental processes as they apply to a variety of contexts (e.g., legal, judicial, employment, mental wellness). Through this program, students learn to understand, evaluate, and predict human behavior and, upon graduation, are prepared to meet the entry requirements for graduate programs in Forensic Psychology or related disciplines and work with, for example, local and federal agencies as part of enforcement, investigative, or behavioral intervention teams.
