The program examines the interconnected dimensions of human security, including health, environmental sustainability, human rights, economic resilience, cybersecurity, political violence, and global governance. Students explore emerging threats shaped by climate change, migration, technological disruption, economic instability, and geopolitical transformation while contrasting human-centered security frameworks with traditional state-centered approaches. Through comparative research, policy analysis, and applied problem solving, the program equips graduates to evaluate resilience across diverse contexts and develop sustainable, evidence-based strategies that promote peace, stability, and security in an increasingly interconnected world.
