Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 ("Title IX")

The Title IX Office provides information resources, grievance options, supportive measures, and training for students, faculty, and staff in support of the university's commitment to excellence in ethical and responsible behavior.

Embry-Riddle is committed to creating and maintaining an inclusive community in which students, faculty, and staff can work together in an atmosphere free from all forms of discrimination. Embry-Riddle is strongly opposed to discrimination and harassment, and such behavior is prohibited by university policy. Embry-Riddle does not discriminate on the basis of sex or pregnancy status in its admissions policies, educational programs, financial aid, employment, or other school administered programs.

The Title IX Office oversees compliance of the Title IX Sexual Harassment and University Sexual Misconduct policies. Policy violations can include sex/pregnancy discrimination, sexual harassment, or sexual violence, such as rape, sexual assault, dating/relationship violence, sexual misconduct, and stalking.
