## Non-Degree Seeking and Transient Students

## Undergraduate

Embry-Riddle recognizes that working adults may be interested in furthering their education for professional or self-enhancement purposes without pursuing a degree program. We also recognize that transient students and those pursuing a degree with another institution may wish to take a course or courses with Embry-Riddle. For these reasons, Embry-Riddle allows students who meet full admission requirements to take up to 24 semester hours as a non-degree seeking or transient student. Official or unofficial transcripts must be submitted to the University before the student is allowed to enroll in courses. Non-degree seeking and transient students must meet full admissions criteria. Note: Engineering coursework is generally restricted to students admitted to engineering programs; however, a waiver may be requested for non-degree applicants. Non-degree seeking students are not subject to course prerequisites. For students who subsequently apply for entry into a degree program, additional documentation may be required.
