

M.S. in Human Security and Resilience

Students will:

- Evaluate the concept of human security and how it contrasts with state-centered security models.
- Analyze the role of Internet-based communications in key security events, including government attempts to control the use of Internet-based technologies.
- Analyze organized communal conflict causes and mitigating mechanisms.
- Identify how global trends contribute to political and economic destabilization and security concerns worldwide and in the United States.
- Evaluate sources of resilience in countries with varying levels of development and its importance to the U.S. national security.
- Analyze case studies on resilience in different countries.
- Analyze the US national, human, and cyber security policy objectives with respect to national and international law.
- Independently conduct innovative research in human security and resilience.
